Description of Duties:

Volunteer is responsible for providing stewardship education and interpretation at the Rosario Tide Pools. Operational duties include staffing the education table or roving the tide pools. Volunteer is expected to greet visitors and provide information about tide pools and the park. As lead, volunteer is responsible for managing one to three additional volunteers or interns to ensure station and shift breaks are covered, and that visitor contacts are recorded. Volunteer is directed to ensure a safe environment for both volunteers and visitors in the absence of park staff and relay any concerns to their supervisor.

Benefits to VIP:

- Informal Interpretive training.
 - Experience communicating with people of diverse cultures.
 - Gained knowledge of tide pool ecosystems and Deception Pass State Park.
 - Experience working in a state park setting as part of a team with other volunteers, interns, and park staff.
 - Ability to obtain an annual Discover Pass after the completion of 24 hours of service.
 - Invitation to attend special trainings and fieldtrips.

Special Requirements:

Volunteer will spend a majority of work time standing. Volunteer must have the ability to take care of themselves and be prepared for extreme sun, wind, or rain. Volunteer must also be able, and feel comfortable, walking on uneven slippery surfaces such as in the Tide Pools (unless special allowances are discussed). Volunteer will be working with the general public and children and is required to pass a background check. Volunteer is required to complete the full multi-day Beach Naturalist Level II Lead training course.
